- Sunday, June 25 The **New Holland Band** which traces its origin to 1829, presents their rousing patriotic program; directed by Dr. Kenneth Laudermitch.
- Sunday, July 2 **Men in Harmony** will premiere a Joseph Martin gospel medley commissioned to celebrate the Mt. Gretna Campmeeting 125th anniversary.
- Sunday, July 9 **Webb Family Singers** have been singing Southern Gospel for 30 years. Seen on national TV. They have been featured with Billy Graham, Charles Stanley, Charles Colson, James Kennedy and on the Wesleyan Hour.
- Sunday, July 16 **Brandywine Harps**, led by director Janet Witman, is an ensemble of Celtic Harpists. They are the first American Harp Orchestra to perform at the Edinburgh, Scotland International Harp Festival.



- Sunday, July 23 **An Old-Fashioned Campmeeting Service** will be led by Rev. Bob Kettering and Dr. Rodney Shearer. Message and music will be taken from campmeetings of that era.
- Friday, July 28 Joe and Sue Martin present a **125th Anniversary Concert**. She has been soloist for Fred Waring's "Pennsylvanians," at Walt Disney World, and on Broadway. Joe is an internationally-known composer, pianist, and conductor.
- Sunday, July 30 A **Massed Choir Concert** of about 200 voices will be conducted by internationally-known composer, pianist, and conductor Joe Martin. The choir will premiere an anthem written by Joe to celebrate the 125th Anniversary.
- Wednesday, August 2 **Worship** service with the genial yet powerful style of **Rev. Quentin Wallace** and music by Covenant United Methodist Church of Lancaster.
- Saturday, August 5 A **Festival of Handbell Choirs** will ring praises to the Glory of God, under the direction of Dr. Sam Robinson of Bucknell University.
- Sunday, August 6 The **National Christian Choir** is a 175 voice choir from over 100 churches in five states in D.C. area. They have sung in Manger Square, Bethlehem, Israel on Christmas Eve; on Focus on the Family, at Crystal Cathedral. Their radio program, "Psalm 95" is heard Sundays at 3:00 p.m. on WDAC 94.5.
- Wednesday, August 9 **Brothers in Grace** have ministered throughout the area delighting audiences with their Southern Gospel style.
- Sunday, August 13 **Worship** service with the **Rev. Dr. Tom Long**, Pastor Emeritus of Preaching, Chandler School of Theology, Emory University, Atlanta, will deliver a dynamic message. Music by Amy Yovanovich, mezzo-soprano.
- Sunday, August 20 **Susquehanna Chorale**, founded in 1981 by artistic director Linda Tedford, is one of the outstanding choral ensembles in the United States. They graciously perform for us each summer.
- Sunday, August 27 **QuintEssentially Brass** is the quintessential way to close out 125 years of uninterrupted Christian programming at Mt. Gretna.
